Dear Parents/Carers

Our theme this half term is called 'Will it Grow?'. During this theme, we will be focusing on science.

In science, we will be learning all about what plants need to help them grow. The children will carry out their own investigations in our edible school garden. In the garden, the children will have the opportunity to observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. We will also learn the names of the different parts of a plant. We will also conclude our learning about seasonal changes as we enter the summer season.

In English, we will be reading traditional tales and writing sentences and stories based on them. We will be using a range of punctuation including capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. In dialogic talk lessons, we will be giving well-structured descriptions about different characters in a story.

In maths, we will be learning to recognise and write numbers to 100. We will be finding one more and one less and will be continuing to add and subtract. We will also be counting in multiples of two, five and ten and exploring fractions.

In PSHE, we will be working through the growing and changing unit as part of our SCARF learning. We will be exploring how to mix paint and will be painting pictures of plants in art. During PE, we will be practising the sports day games (athletics) ready for our competition. In the computer room, we will be continuing with coding and learning about spreadsheets.

We will also be visiting Lister Park and going into Cartwright Hall for a workshop.

Helping at home:

As well as ensuring that your child completes their weekly homework, you could:

- Read with your child regularly.
- Take your child for a walk in the park or the woods. Look at all the different flowers and plants you can see.
- Grow some seeds at home. Talk about what is happening to them and what they need to help them grow.
