Our next theme of the year is called 'Destination Dilemma'. During this theme, we will be focusing on geography, music and art.

We will begin the theme by using our geographic skills to locate London and the Alpine region on a variety of maps. Then, we will study these locations by comparing their key physical and human features. Finally, using our map skills, we will develop our knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world.

We will be looking at cityscapes in art and will create our own piece of work based on Monet's depiction of a city using water colours.

In music, we will be continuing our work in Charanga as well as playing and performing with the glockenspiel in solo and ensemble contexts. We will also be learning about musical notations.

In English, we will be writing a persuasive text that encourages people to buy our buzz wire games that we created in design technology. Our class novel will continue to be The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe.

In oracy and dialogic talk sessions, we will be learning to articulate and justify answers, arguments and opinions, participate in discussions, presentations and debates and ask relevant questions to extend understanding and knowledge.

From our activity passport, we will make Alpine cheese toast, use a protractor to create art, explore a city using Google Maps and continue to learn how to play the glockenspiel.



In RE, we will continue studying about Sikhism and their commitment to God. Before moving on to studying what Christians believe about Jesus' death and resurrection.

In computing, we will look at Online Relationships and our Online Reputation in Online Safety lessons and will develop our blogging skills in computing lessons.

Then in PSHE, we will be learning how we are all unique and the importance of tolerance. In our French topic, we will continue to learn how to talk about ourselves and our computing focus is online relationships. Finally, in PE, we will continue our focus on team games and dance.
